Regular Meeting April 16, 2018

Trustee Schmidt called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM, with the Pledge of Allegiance. Roll call: Likley -aye, Horner – aye, Schmidt – aye.

Comments from the floor

- Mike Lyons Medina County Assistant Prosecutor attended to discuss the Type 2 Annexation of 1.7616 acres of land to the Village of Gloria Glens.
 - All owners of the land must agree to the annexation, the annexed parcel remains with the township for Real Estate tax purposes.
 - Medina County Parks has signed the application and no conditions exist to reject the application.
 - o Trustees did not receive a copy of the application until it was requested by them.
 - A notice was received from the County Commissioners on April 9th. The County received the annexation application on April 4th and it should have been sent to the Township within 5 days.
 - Lyons will clarify the statute regarding the timing whether it should be mailed within 5 days or received by certified mail within 5 days. This may present a deficiency depending on the exact language.
 - o Parcel numbers listed on the application need to be verified and validated.
 - A parcel can be split between 2 Townships
 - Adjacent parcels need to be identified to correct any mislabeling.
 - o If there are deficiencies in the application, they can be corrected with a new application.
 - Trustee Likley is not supporting the loss of property since all services identified in the application as a reason for the annexation are currently available. WFRD, Sheriff's Department as well as Water & Sewer are provided. Nothing new will be gained by the annexation.
 - Additional attempts for further annexation are a concern. Land east of this annexation is the Chippewa Lake Properties.
 - Trustee Schmidt expressed that Medina County is a collaborative community and he take issue with Gloria Glens lack of communication to find an amicable solution.
 - In May, 2017 there was an annexation request, Westfield Township did not support that request.
 - Seems there is an ulterior motive to the annexation as services provided.
 - Medina Co. Park District Director Tom Jones applicant was told by Gloria Glens officials it has fire service from Layfette.
 - Lyons was asked whether the County Commissioners can deny the application based on services. He replied no.
 - Annexation is usually done to pursue additional services.

- o The question was raised whether Lafayette Fire is a district. If it is then it should be a separate entity outside the Board of Trustees. It would require its own budget & board. Also, if Gloria Glens joins then it becomes a Joint District.
- o Trustee Likley will prepare a letter of objection to the County Commissioners.
- Lyons reminded the Board that the Prosecutors Office advises the Commissioners not the Township.
- o A resolution by the Trustees is needed to formally reject the request for annexation. The deadline to respond is April 29th.
 - A special meeting will be scheduled for the passing of the resolution.

Likley makes a motion to schedule a Special Meeting for the purpose of presenting a resolution regarding the Annexation request by the Village of Gloria Glens and General Business on April 21, 2018 at 1:00 PM; seconded by Horner. Roll call: Horner – aye, Schmidt – aye, Likley – aye. The motion passes.

Minutes to be approved

- Likley makes a motion to accept the March 12, 2018 Special & General Business meeting minutes as presented; seconded by Schmidt. Roll call: Likley aye, Horner aye, Schmidt aye. The motion passes.
- Likley makes a motion to accept the April 2, 2018 Regular meeting minutes as presented; seconded by Horner. Roll call: Schmidt aye. Likley aye, Horner aye. The motion passes.

Road Report

- The approved roads contract with Sarver Paving has not been received back from the Medina County Prosecutor's office at the time of this meeting.
- Coal patching within the Township is being done.
- A traffic study at the corner of Ryan Road and Buffham is needed to count the number of cars and trucks passing through that area.
- Roads Supervisor Evans is scheduled to attend the Ohio Pipeline seminar on the morning of April 17th regarding safety practices.
- The chassis for the new truck is due around July 1st.
- NEO Lawn services will be notified that they won the 2018 season mow bid.
- Asplundh is nearly finished with tree trimming in the area and will be moving up to Brunswick to continue their work.
- No road closures due to flooding at the time of this meeting.

Cemetery

- Trustees have a deed to sign for a current lot sale.
- 4 lots were transferred Old deed numbers are referenced and new deed numbers were assigned.
- Regulation wording is necessary regarding the mandatory use of a steel or concrete vault and the statement "positively no internment in wooden boxes" will be removed. Language addressing cremation will be added.

- Kratzer hearing was held on April 4, 2017 regarding pending litigation.
 - o BZA met on April 16th for their Notice of Decision
- Next regular meeting April 18th at 6:30 PM Deer Pass site plan will be reviewed with the request to add a restaurant to their club house.
- Zoning Map Update Public Hearing needs to be scheduled. Planning services & commission recommendations have been received.

- Levy committee is continuing to work to get the word out to the community prior to the May 8th voting date.
- 1st round of information post cards have been sent out.
- Signs have been put up throughout the district and more will be distributed.
- 2nd mailer will be sent out at the end of April.

- The WFRD facebook page has added new videos regarding the need for an adequate Safety Service Building.
